

- US \$387B of members' money (2013)





All Accident Rate for IATA Members vs. Non-Members




Accidents Update: As at 30 Jun 2014

Economic Forecast


Total Air Travel and Air Freight Volumes

Total Passenger and Freight Capacity






Fleet Growth Projections by Boeing



(Enhanced)E-IOSA Benefits

- Increased continuity of conformance with IOSA standards
- Improved levels of implementation of IOSA standards and consequently of the applicable ICAO requirements
- Global standardization of auditing techniques and methodology
- Increased reliability of QA programs
- Improved auditing skills
- Improved regulatory confidence in airlines' internal oversight



IATA Standard Safety Assessment (ISSA)

The ISSA program will address:

- Commercial passenger and/or cargo operations
- Aircraft with one or more turbine powered or multiple reciprocating engines
- Two-pilot operations
- → IFR and/or VFR operations
- Operators with aircraft with MTOW above 5.7t will be allowed on ISSA Registry for one term (2 years) after which an IOSA Audit must be pursued



Aircraft Tracking Task Force "ATTF"

The Aircraft Tracking Task Force (ATTF) met just after the ICAO Special Multi-disciplinary Meeting on Global Flight Tracking that was held on May 12-13th in Montreal.



ATTF Objectives and Scope

- Examine available options for tracking commercial aircraft
- Consider: Implementation, Time, Complexity and Cost Efficiency
- Assess the responses to the ICAO vendor survey
- Examine existing capabilities
- Provide potential recommendations



ATTF Timeline

- Initial draft completed and currently under review
- Accepted draft presented to the IATA Board of Directors – December 4, 2014
- ✓ Upon acceptance the report will be presented to ICAO before December 31, 2014
- Release to the public thereafter
